He is risen! (For the record, I started working on this article on March 2, because I knew that with Easter falling on March 31, there is no way I would have time to compose a marginally coherent article with everything going on during Holy Week.


(Fast-forward a month and I am finishing this article April 3<sup>rd</sup> ...)

One of the traditions we have in the church is to refrain from saying "Alleluia" or "He is risen!" during Lent. And while I am a big fan of tradition and doing things "the way we've always done them", I have zero hesitation in saying "Alleluia" or "He is risen!" at (supposedly) "inappropriate" times (like I did on Good Friday). This isn't a case of Pastor Nick flippantly disregarding tradition. If you read our Lutheran funeral liturgy, it makes no mention of omitting the "He is risen. He is risen, indeed!" response during Lent. This is with good reason. We are an Easter people 24-7.

Jesus sacrificial death and glorious resurrection define who we are. Too often, we wait for Jesus' second coming like He's still in the grave. He's not! The tomb is empty. Christ is risen! What's stopping us from proclaiming what He's done for us?

We are thankful for donations to replace the A/C unit in the sanctuary. It has been installed and functional. We have paid the contractor. To date, \$4500 of the

You might notice a storage container near the ECC playground. This is to store outdoor equipment for the ECC playground. Progress continues for the infant/toddler rooms. Volunteers are working hard towards completion. Mid to late April is the goal to ask for final inspections.

We are continuing to work towards getting our new Infant room open. While we might or might not make our hoped-for April 15th date, we are doing all we can to get it there. The biggest drag we face is final inspection by both KDHE and the Fire Marshall -- we are at the mercy of their schedules and unforeseeable conflicts, and we have to be basically complete before we ask them to come out. Meanwhile, we have hired 2 new Teachers and a new Cook, and we are looking for 1 more Teacher

and 2 Assistant Teachers. We have had a few new enrollments, which means our older rooms are getting full, so we need the Assistant Teachers so we can take in more kiddos. Please keep praying for our success!

#### **Bethany's Community Garden**

The garden is up and growing again. For the month of March

I have planted twenty cabbage plants, strawberries, and garlic. All look great. This year the garden will have plenty of flowers to give some color and attract pollinators like honey bees and butterflies. Planting early can be complicated with the covering plants need from hard freezes. They need protection at night, but

plants need from hard freezes. They ne they also need sunlight during the day. That's a lot of effort but the reward is worth it. It is just so enjoyable to see all the beauty in our garden full of life. Our new composter is waiting for kitchen scraps. We can also use lawn clippings as mowing season nears, provided you do not treat your lawns with chemicals, April and May are the busiest months for planting. If anyone wants to get down & dirty while you

Community Garden Compost Materials

A. Safe to add to compost: Vegetable peelings and some fruit peelings, Used coffee grounds, Used tea bags, Egg shells, Green grass clippings (Exception: Lawn treated with weed and crab grass killer), Animal manure, Crushed dead tree leaves, Straw, Coffee filters B. Do not add to compost: Meat products, High fat content such as oils and grease, Dairy products, Baked goods, Raw eggs, Citrus fruit or peelings (Oranges, Grapefruit, Lemons, Limes, etc.), Diseased or pest infested plants, Black Walnut, Eucalyptus, Oak, or Beech tree leaves, Chemically treated yard clippings and other plants. LWML meets on the 2nd Tuesday of each month at 4:00pm for a short business meeting, fellowship and Bible Study from the current LWML Quarterly. All women are welcome. For more information call Ruth Valdez at (316) 213-0177. Quilting ladies meet on Tuesdays at 10am and on Saturdays at 9am for quilting and fellowship. There have been 77 quilts finished this year so far. Backpacks are being sewn now also. LWML would like to thank all who have made, and those who continue to make "soft eyeglass cases" for the eyeglasses and reading glasses collected for MOST Ministries. This week a total of 8 regular eyeglasses, 56 sunglasses and 46 pair of reading glasses were sent to MOST Ministries, with most of those glasses sent in the soft eyeglass cases. Those eliminated the need for bubble wrap. Our container on the donation table in the hallway, across from the church office is now empty and ready to again receive glasses and more soft eyeglass cases.

On April 13th, three of our LWML ladies, Marcia Hampton, Mary Morton and Ruth Valdez, will be attending the 2024 LWML Kansas District Convention at the Double Tree by Hilton Hotel here in Wichita. Mary and Ruth are voting delegates and will be voting on 4 of the 9 God's Gracious Gift Grant Proposals that were submitted. Bethany submitted one of these Grant Proposals and if ours is one of the four grants chosen to be funded, those funds will go to provide partial school supplies and/or adult "welcome" bags for the unchurched at some of our neighboring apartment complexes closest to us. This outreach project would also provide an outreach opportunity to invite these individuals to church and to hear the Word of God. We would like your prayers that our grant will be one of the four grants chosen to receive grant monies when we vote at the convention next month. We will also be voting for up to 5 mission grants. There were 18 mission grants submitted, all of which are worthy of being selected but it will be up to the voting delegates to select the top 5 grants who will receive the funding. So again, we ask for your prayers as we attend and vote at the convention.

God's Gracious Gifts Fund (GGGF) is supported by memorials, honorariums, Thrivent choice dollars and other designated donations. The recipients are selected by delegates at the 2024 LWML Kansas District Convention in Wichita. GGGF grants are distributed immediately after the 2024 convention. Mission grants are funded from Mite Box offerings and other designated offerings. Grants are selected at the 2024 LWML Kansas District convention in Wichita. Mission grants are awarded throughout the 2024-2026 biennium as donations allow and in the order of number of votes received.

Our next meeting will be on Tuesday, April 9th, 4:00 pm with a short business meeting, Bible Study from the LWML Quarterly and fellowship. All ladies are welcome to join us!


