

Early Childhood Center Update



(1) WE'RE OPEN !!!

We want to thank everyone for their prayers and support through our (unexpectedly) long process of expanding our Daycare program.

It has paid off! Our new Infant room will now be OPEN this Monday, the 29th of July! Praise the Lord! Miracles do happen!

Not only is our Infant room open, but we have the Teachers on staff now to allow us to fill our other rooms to our licensed capacity. Our enrollment has already d 8 babies to our enrollment through the addition of the Infant room

increased, and we will add 8 babies to our enrollment through the addition of the Infant room.

This has been a longer process than anyone imagined when we started out, partly because of bureaucratic rigamarole as well as the tough state of today's employment market. From the Fire Marshall losing our paperwork to KDHE being hit by a cyber attack, in between all the inspections and approval processes, we were faced with delay after delay. But that is all behind us now, and we are OPENING our new services. We now offer a full range of child daycare from 6 weeks of age to 5 years old. The demand for care from families with babies and older children certainly exists, and we are now one of too few Centers that offer Infant care.

(2) IT'S PAID FOR!

At the end of June, we came to the end of the Kansas Children's Cabinet & Trust Fund grant...and we were able to claim all of the \$109,000 we were awarded through the grant. That money was dedicated to specific areas: Paying the salaries of our new Staff members during this time of transition, paying for their hiring costs (job ads, etc), buying supplies and materials for the newly remodeled rooms, paying for some Teacher training, paying for the ECC's share of utilities and insurance during the expansion process, and paying for an expansion and rehabilitation of the playground. The expansion of our Early Childhood (Daycare) program has been carried out without a net cost to the Church's budget, and now we are positioned to take in enough children to actually make our ECC profitable. With the opening of Infant care, we revamped (raised) our tuition rates to match going market prices. This will result in more income for the same number of children enrolled. If our enrollment meets projections, our Daycare will not be a financial burden to Bethany like our Day School used to be, but rather it will provide positive income for Bethany.

(3) PLAYGROUND IMPROVEMENTS

The grant ended up paying for some new play equipment, some repair to existing equipment, a new, bigger and better fence, and rubber mulch (12 tons of it) for the play surface. These items are not here yet -- they have been ordered and should be installed over the next month or two. Watch for these improvements to the playground!

(4) THANK YOU!

We want to thank Mark Welty and his Trustees for all the construction work that had to be done to make all of this happen. We want to thank individual donors who donated materials to help make the construction happen. We want to thank our Danita (our ECC Director), Pastor Nick, and Mark Welty for their patience in dealing with the many bureaucratic headaches and hassles. We want to thank Bill Bolin, Jr., for his help with budgeting. We want to thank all of YOU for your continued support and prayers throughout this effort!

And most of all, we thank and praise God, from whom all blessings flow! May His purpose for Bethany be fulfilled! This is truly a team effort, and with this great team of ours, we (God and you) have made it happen! THANK YOU!

Bethany's Community Garden

On the 25th of July, several children from the ECC gathered and I showed them how to water the plants, how to pick a ripe tomato, and how to pick a summer squash.

The tomato production has slowed down a little because of spider mites affecting the plants. We are using a home made remedy of soap and herbs. The summer squash and zucchini are producing. So are the sweet peppers and eggplant. Soon we will have cantaloupe and watermelons. We harvested a good crop or Irish potatoes. Two new additions to the garden are strawberries and blackberries. We will be picking them next year. We have been planting seeds for a fall garden. There will be more cabbage, green beans, Irish potatoes, beets, cucumbers, okra, lettuce, spinach, radish, etc. The excessive heat is always a challenge. We have several shade cloths that were donated by members and we are mulching with dried leaves and straw. Feel free to stop by the garden to see what is growing. 
