There is a bit of a holiday desert between the celebration of Christmas and Easter. The “relief” comes this month on the 14th as we celebrate St. Valentine’s Day. The stores already display the candy and cards for us to peruse and find just the right one for our “Valentine.” The day even shows up in our liturgical calendar as “Valentine, Martyr.”

Yes, St. Valentine was a real person. There are actually three men might have served as the origin of the commemoration. The most likely is Valentinus of Rome. The celebration that the world around us holds tends toward the sentimental and the sensuous – toward romantic love. It pretty much ignores the notion of martyrdom.

It’s easy to connect Valentine and love, especially through the events surrounding Valentine of Rome’s execution. He wrote a letter of love – in Christ – to the jailer’s daughter. That letter even has another legend surrounding it – it was written on a heart-shaped document and was signed “your Valentine.”

In contrast to the world around us, our celebration of St. Valentine’s day is not about romantic love; it is about love of Christ. It is about death being a defeated enemy because Christ defeated it in His own death. Here are the three stanzas of LSB hymn #706. Though this hymn was written recently (1978) for a wedding it is far removed from romantic sentimentality.

Love in Christ is strong and living, Binding faithful hearts in one;
Love in Christ is true and giving. May His will in us be done.

Love is patient and forbearing, Clothed in Christ’s humility,
Gentle, selfless, kind, and caring, Reaching out in charity.

Love in Christ abides forever, Fainting not when ills attend;
Love, forgiving and forgiven, Shall endure until life’s end.


Husbands, it is okay to buy a box of chocolates for your rib (Genesis 2:24). Wives, it is good to find just the right card for your lord (1 Peter 3:6). Widows and widowers; rejoice in thanksgiving for the gifts that God gave you in marriage to those who now sleep in the Lord. Only remember to look at all of these gifts through the love of Christ. He is the foundation from which we are receiving all of this love.

Christ defines love in His life and in His Word. It is long suffering. Emotions are tamed. It is kind. Paul lists eight things that love is not (1 Cor. 13:4b-6a). Love isn’t jealous, doesn’t brag, and is not puffed-up with self-importance. It doesn’t act in an unbecoming way, as in the behavior of homosexuals (Rom. 1:27). Hardest of all, love is not self-seeking, easily provoked, and doesn’t keep a ledger of wrongs. Finally, love will not give approval to wickedness or even delight in hearing of it. Why? Because love delights and rejoices in the good and the true. These are given to us by our Lord.

Early Childhood Center Update

Bethany's Early Childhood Center continues to make its way in the world, which is what we prepare our children to do. We prepare the children entrusted to us to make their way in the world, with a foundation in Christ.

We are finally fully staffed once again with the hiring of a new full-time Assistant Teacher and a part-time Assistant Teacher. Jennifer Gallacher joined our staff at the very end of the year as a full time Assistant. She is qualified to work as a Lead Teacher, so we are ready to address any new staff shortages that may arise. In early January, we added Alyssa Davis on a part-time schedule as an Assistant in training, with the goal of having her complete her certifications so that she can launch her chosen career in child care and so that we can develop a fully certified Teacher, something that is not easy to come by in these modern times.

These two additions came right in the nick of time, as Taryn gave birth to her baby two weeks ago, so she will be out for an undetermined period of time. Taryn has been filling the "float" position as a fully-qualified Lead Teacher, so we will continue to be adequately staffed during her absence. Meanwhile, our new staffing level means that we are ready to accept more children who need daycare services. We are ready for growth!! 


Stewardship Team update:

We made it through 2022 thanks to the set aside funds for a new Pastor and Assistant to the Pastor which totaled a little over \$45,000. We also benefitted from some daycare assistance grant funds of \$30,000 which helped pay salaries & benefits for daycare workers. For 2023 we will start out with a

small reserve due to the reduced salary and no benefits that Pastor Meyer is receiving. When a new Pastor accepts our call, the expenses will go back to a similar amount we were paying Pastor Schnelle which could be difficult due to our current income situation. We are excited to share a delicious and filling way to support Fairmount Ministries ... Any guesses?

That's right, it's time for Bierocks! Our Annual Bierock fundraiser is right around the corner! Sales are now open, as

well as the sign-up for volunteers. We need several volunteers to make this possible and have a few training opportunities to lead up to the event so you can learn the ins and outs of making a bierock (both are delicious)! What is a bierock, you ask?

According to the somewhat reliable source at Wikipedia:

- A Bierock is a yeast dough pastry pocket sandwich with savory filling, originating in Prussia.
- The dish is common among the Volga German community in the United States and Argentina. It was brought to the United States in the 1870s by German Russian Mennonite immigrants.
- It has developed strong cultural associations with the cuisine of the Midwestern United States [such as Kansas & Nebraska (Runza)]

[Traditionally] The soft yeast rolls contain some sugar, butter and eggs, and either warm water, milk, or a mix of both. The filling is a basic mix of onion, ground beef and cabbage[1] which can be made more complicated by the addition of different cheese blends, condiments and seasonings like caraway seeds.

Our chef and local caterer, Ashley Mayes has perfected a recipe with delicious fillings of groundbeef, sausage, cabbage and cheese. We hope you will consider joining us by purchasing some delicious bierocks and volunteering for our event! Details are below.
