## **Early Childhood Center Update**



Our new Infant room will be open any day now. The delays of the government agencies who regulate us have been very frustrating. Our work on the new Infant room and the remodeled Toddler room is all done now, and WE have been ready to open for a couple of weeks. The State Fire Marshall finally finished their last inspection and they have given us the go-ahead to open. Now we are waiting on our #1 regulator, the Kansas Dept of Health & Environment (KDHE) to give us our final inspection and official okay to

open. Well, they say they are delayed by a State-level

cybersecurity breach. Previously, both agencies had lost our paperwork at one point or another. So, our date to open has been pushed back and pushed back, but we now have the necessary staff and the new rooms are done -- WE are ready to go!

Meanwhile, we have added 6 new children to our enrollment this month. The day we open our Infant room we will add 8 more.

Please continue to pray for us as we navigate these governmental obstacles to our success.

May is the busiest month to plant vegetables that grow best in warmer

temperatures. The

cabbage is almost ready for harvest. This year, the cabbage heads are larger than they have ever been. The sugar snap peas are blooming and the pods are maturing. Soon we will be enjoying those crunchy delights. The potatoes and tomatoes are getting bushier and taller. Some rose moss flowers are blooming. I have sunflower seeds for five different varieties that will produce multiple branches and will bloom up to the first frost. I am hoping for plenty of cut flowers. I truly appreciate everyone that has given their leaves, grass clippings, horse manure and hay. Now, I have plenty. However, the composter needs a steady supply of kitchen scraps all season. This year has not been without challenges and



disappointments. The peppers had to be replanted. Regardless, we keep moving forward. Keep watching for the wonders God will bless us with. As Always, Vicky Collins 316-771-1207



**Community Garden Compost Materials** A. Safe to add to compost: Vegetable peelings and some fruit peelings, Used coffee grounds, Used tea bags, Egg shells, Green grass clippings (Exception: Lawn treated with weed and crab grass killer), Animal manure, Crushed dead tree leaves, Straw, Coffee filters

B. Do not add to compost: Meat products, High fat content such as oils and grease, Dairy products, Baked goods, Raw eggs, Citrus fruit or peelings (Oranges, Grapefruit, Lemons, Limes, etc.), Diseased or pest infested plants, Black Walnut, Eucalyptus, Oak, or Beech tree leaves, Chemically treated yard clippings and other plants.
