The sermon was done on Saturday and this newsletter article is being completed on July 30th.


Stewardship Report





Bethany's Garden Where Flowers and People Bloom!!

The months of July and August are the hardest for gardeners and plants because of the heat. The best way to save the garden is to keep it watered and use shade cloths.

It really makes a difference to lower the temperatures. You can also use straw around the base of your plants. This helps retain the moisture which is what the plants need. All of this will hopefully keep your plants alive.

However, the heat and humidity does cause plants to stop producing. You may have blooms but no vegetables. As far as our garden there is no heat damage. The leaves are a deep green and very large. The garden well was broken down for a few days and with the extra help and rain the garden survived without any damage. I enjoy experimenting with first time vegetables, flowers and herbs each year. This year for the first time we are growing Armenian cucumbers, three types of winter squash, Brussel sprouts, and butter beans. Also, for the first time we have a herb garden with four varieties of basil, oregano, rosemary, cilantro, sage, dill and peppermint. We had our first incident of vandalism for this year. Someone smashed two Honey Dew melons and a watermelon on the parking lot. To make worse I found squash bug eggs on the Zucchini, winter squash and cucumbers. Even after so much the

Early Childhood Center

Our children and Teachers are enjoying the summer in our daycare center, engaging in activities that have them outside in the morning but chilling-out indoors in the afternoon. Our activities are more than play, they are learning adventures designed for these age groups.

We have signed-up 4 new babies for our infant room, and a 5th will be coming in November. This means that our infant room will finally be full in a couple

of months, and then we will have one age-out of the room (graduate) before the next new one comes in, so we should get full by the end of summer and stay that way for several months beyond. Finally!

We have now been fully APPROVED for the State food reimbursement program, and we are turning in our first week's worth of paperwork, so that money will start coming to us now. This may provide us with up to \$3,000 or more of new income every month to offset our expenses.

As the summer ends, we will see the oldest children graduate from our program as they go off to kindergarten. This happens every year: The oldest kids move on, and new ones come in. Please pray that new enrollment will keep our numbers up where they need to be to assure our continued success.

Westside UMC Food Pantry


