Moving forward with roof repair and insurance payouts. Two items remain to be completed, the garage roof and building gutter. We must repair the structure to accept the new gutter. That is a work in progress. We are working with Brotherhood Mutual to possibly ask for more coverage. This must be done after we receive invoices that reflect additional costs above original payout. Which means after work is completed. That date has yet to be determined. We now have the boiler decommissioned and state/insurance have been duly notified. Now we have the task of supplying heat to the north wing before winter, along with weekly chores on the property.

Bethany's Garden Where Flowers and People Bloom!!



Fried Okra

Ingredients

Yields 4 servings

- -10 pods okra, sliced in ¼-inch pieces
- -1 egg, beaten, -1 cup cornmeal, -1/4 teaspoon salt
- -1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper, 1/2 cup vegetable oil

Directions

- -Soak okra in beaten egg in a small bowl for 5 to 10 minutes.
- -Combine cornmeal, salt, and pepper in a medium bowl.
- -Heat oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat. Dredge okra in the cornmeal mixture, coating evenly.
- -Carefully place okra in hot oil; stir continuously. -Reduce heat to medium when okra first starts to brown, and cook until golden. -Drain on paper towels.

LWMI Fall Event



Westside UMC Food Pantry



Book of the Month: **Hope in the Wilderness**, "The book of Numbers is often described a bit like the American Midwest. Many people from the East and West Coasts think of it as



"flyover country" something without much real substance. However, just as the Midwest has its good and bad points, so, too, does the history of the people of Israel recorded in Numbers. R. Reed Lessing has produced a study that will show you how the book of Numbers is relevant to Christians and Christian living today. His book helps you see not only the point of the vivid stories of Israel's sins in Numbers but even the relevance of the census chapters, Balaam and his prophecy-for-hire that did not turn out as Balak hoped, and the worship laws recorded in Numbers 28-29. Lessing's devotional style makes this the ideal book for those

who want to know the book of Numbers better while applying it to their daily walk of faith."


