NOTE #1:	THE YEAR TO DATE BALANCE FOR THE ENTIRE CHURCH IS \$936.48.					
NOTE #2:	The CACFP grant program reimbursed food and operations costs are now arriving on a monthly basis.					
NOTE #3:	\$10,000 was drawn from the Line of Credit and is included in the ECC's Year To Date revenues.					
NOTE #4	Monthly payments are currently being made to repay the \$30,000 borrowed through a Line of Credit.					
NOTE #5	When there is a total church-wide shortfall of funds, monies are borrowed from the Designated Funds. The funds are repaid as they are needed or when the church has funds available.

2026 BUDGET

On December 17th, the congregation approved the 2026 budget. The budget consists of two main parts, Church and Early Childhood Center. Each has its own revenue and expenses and share the costs of building insurance and utilities. For 2026 the church's projected revenues of \$294,000 are equal to its projected expenses. The ECC's projected revenues of \$576,280 are based upon tuition for 45 children (\$540,280) and a reimbursement grant (\$36,000). Revenues are projected to exceed costs. The church's staff portion of the budget covers the salaries, wages, taxes and benefits for the pastor, administrative assistant, organist, choir director, assistant, guest pastors and guest organists. The total cost is \$162,865.29. The remaining costs are \$131,134.71 and they pay for the normal operation of the church and the building. The exceptions are the church pays 56.93% of the utilities and insurance, and the church is making payments to the roofer for the remaining unpaid balance on the roof. The Early Childhood Center (ECC), like the church, has employee expenses of wages, taxes and benefits. These costs total \$375,066.89. Their remaining costs are for food, 43.03% of utilities and insurance, general expenses, classroom expenses, marketing and repayment of the line of credit and designated funds. These remaining expenses total \$130,792.70. The anticipated revenues exceed expected expenses by \$70,420. This potential excess comes from the tuition increase put in place in August that was based upon 39 children and high enough to pay all costs plus \$629 a month to repay the line of credit. This budget is based upon 45 children which was near the current average number of children. The management team, once the entire line of credit and designated funds are repaid, is looking at how the extra funds should be used.

November Financial Report

For November, the church's revenues exceeded expenditures by \$14,951.68. The Early Childhood Center also had a positive balance of \$197.75. For the first eleven months of the year the church had a positive balance of \$45,050.87. The ECC lost \$44,114.39. It has had a positive monthly balance all but one month since raising tuition in August. The church's year to date balance is \$936.48. Any questions, please contact Bill Bolin.


Besides quilts there are other items that are made for Lutheran World

Health Kits: dark bath towel.




Sewing Kits: 3yards of cotton/cotton blend fabric, spools of thread.


Your Input is Needed!
